As a Respiratory Therapist for 28 years I have been made aware that it is easier to prevent respiratory disease than to treat it once it occurs. I've seen first hand what it is like for people not to be able to take a breath - something most of us take for granted. The causes of respiratory diseases have been well documented & studied for 30 years. This proposal will have significant health impacts due to the increase in diesel emissions from diesel powered

trains & from toxic coal dust blowing off as many as 16 mile & a half long coal trains/day. People who live within 3 miles of the railines would be disproportionately affected, & children the elderly & those with chronic conditions would be at highest risk. Another concern is the long delays that 12-16 trains/day would cause for 1st responders & emergency services.

There are absolutely no 'good' health affects from breathing coal dust Diesel emissions delays at level crossings or burning coal in ASIA.

I encourage a Health Impact Statement to be part of the EIS that addresses all these health & environmental concerns
