The impact of a coal export terminal in Longview will reach far beyond the local community, especially if other coal export terminals and oil exports are approved. It is imperative to consider the whole picture, to see how communities from Wyoming to Washington are affected by train traffic, coal dust, train diesel emissions, water quality, and climate change. I urge the Army Corps of Engineers, State Dept of Ecology, and Cowlitz County to adopt a broad scope for the environmental impact statement.

Global warming affects all of us, and it is false to assume that China will burn other coal if they don't get ours - increasingly, China is moving away from coal, especially in light of their air-quality crisis. You also cannot assume that the coal will be exported

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from B.C. if it doesn't go from Washington state, because B.C. has been rejecting similar efforts. As someone who hopes to live to a ripe old age healthily, I am deeply concerned about the effects of climate change - and that coal should stay in the ground.
